


About the Foundation for Polish Science

FNP supports its' laureates in the application of best practices in data management


The cost of Open Access publications can be covered from the indirect costs in FNP's projects

Not OA; 1315; 29% Open Access; 3273; 71% "Highly cited "* WoS publications resulting from FNP projects in 2018-2022.




*papers that rank in the top 1% by citations for field and year in the Web of Science
