15 Member States and Associated Countries | 22 Partners













































- Objective to contribute to the EOSC implementation by:
 - Expanding national e-infrastructures
 - Building human capacities
- In practice this means more:
 - Compute and storage available
 - Datasets and tools to expand avenues of research





EOSC Nordic

- Project taking place in 2019-2022
- Objectives for project to:
 - Facilitate coordination of initiatives for open science
 - Exploit synergies
 - Achieve greater harmonisation at policy and service provision
- Compliance with agreed EOSC standards and practices
- Brought together a consortium of 24 partners

 "Widening participation and strengthening the European Research Area" (WIDERA)


 NCP_WIDERA.NET is a 3-year project aiming at empowering the network of National Contact Points for WIDERA

 WIDERA call in 2024 to "Support to the development and implementation of policies and practices for reproducibility of scientific results"






Organisations with Policy on FAIR Data
