Accelerating the uptake of high-quality open research practices

- The UK Reproducibility Network (UKRN) is a peer-led consortium working to ensure that the UK remains a centre for world-leading research.
- UK Reproducibility Network's Open Research Programme (ORP) running from UKRN ORP's three objectives are broadly:
 - (1) developing and delivering high-quality **training**;
 - (2) developing and delivering a framework of **evaluation** of institutional practice;
 - (3) sharing effective practice and promoting the alignment of **incentives**


